ABOUT US

A private, non-denominational, non-profit organization whose purpose is to **raise awareness in society** and work to solve the **problems caused by hunger, food waste** and, in general, the lack of resources necessary to lead a decent life.

To achieve our goal we manage the **Food Bank of Madrid** whose mission is:



Get free food and distribute it, also free, of charge, **to charities legally recognized** that assist the most disadvantaged people of the Community of Madrid. We do not deliver food directly to final beneficiaries.



Fight against squandering, recovering surplus food in origin, and **Food waste**, in the final stages of commercialization, **contributing to sustainability**. We avoid the destruction of food and CO2 emissions.. We promote the circular economy.



Raise awareness especially among children, adolescents and young people on social vulnerability, food deficiencies and the importance of their contribution to help people in need and avoid food waste.

OUR PRINCIPLES

Neutrality: We do not discriminate by ideology or creed if it is not contrary to our principles and the dignity of people is respected.

Free of charge: In all phases of the process: procurement, distribution and management.

We are austere. We request only what is essential to cover basic needs.

95% of people who work at the Food Bank do so for free. No managerial position is paid.

Professionalism: Most of our volunteers are pre-retired or retired professionals who contribute with their knowledge and experience.

Transparency: We are accredited by the Lealtad Foundation, which guarantees compliance with transparency and good practices. Our accounts are public and audited.

OUR WORK IS VERY NECESSARY

Because poverty exists:

**One of every 6 residents in the Community of Madrid lives in poverty:
1,251,426 people, 19% its total population**



505,000 people live in severe poverty, which has increased by 36% compared to the previous period. They live in households whose income is equal to or less than € 355 per unit of consumption.



350,000 people live in severe material deprivation: 4.7% of the population of the Community of Madrid. They cannot cope with at least 4 of the 9 basic consumption concepts.

(Eg eating protein twice a week, being able to keep the house at a suitable temperature, etc.).

And food waste is already unsustainable:

Commitment 2030: Spain is committed to reducing food waste by 50%. **UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** (2015).



We are the 7th country in the EU that wastes the most: 7.7 M Tm per year.



The economic impact is € 12,000 million a year.

ORIGIN AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE FOOD WE DELIVER

RECOVERY:

- **Withdrawal Fruits and Vegetables Program (EU).** Agricultural surplus.
- **Central market surplus (Mercamadrid).** Mainly fruits and vegetables from wholesalers.
- **Food industry.**
- **Distribution chains** (supermarkets and hypermarkets). Direct deliveries to charities.
- **Fair surpluses.** Direct deliveries to charities.

DONATION:

- **Kilo Operations** (companies, schools and events) and the **Great Collection.**
- **FEGA-FEAD.** European Food aid program for the most disadvantaged people.
- **FESBAL** (Spanish Federation of Food Banks).

MAIN NUMERICAL DATA 2019

TOTAL BENEFICIARIES

- Food has been distributed through 547 Charities.
- 154,185 people have been served with a daily meal (9,035 are infants).
- 50,820,000 meals provided in total.

FOODS

- 20,670,169 kg. of food distributed to charities.
- We have distributed an average of 90,000 kilos a day.
- More than 296 food companies have donated food.

SUSTAINABILITY

- We have avoided the destruction of more than 11,000,000 kilos of food.

VOLUNTEERING

- 408 permanent volunteers (104 F, 304 M) with an average age of 65 years.
- More than 24,000 occasional volunteers have participated in the Great Collection, Kilo Operations and Events.
- 2,268 school students have collaborated as volunteers.
- 2,571 employees from 110 companies have collaborated as corporate volunteers.

KILO OPERATIONS

- 282 carried out in schools and other educational entities.
- 367 in companies and public and private institutions.
- 109 at events and fairs.
- 5 in distribution chains with a total of 123 points of sale.

GREAT COLLECTION DATA

- 2,750,000 kg of collected food.
- 1,081 donation points.
- 11,975 volunteers in stores.
- 3,500 volunteers in classification.



From 1994 to 2019 we have distributed 229 million kilos of food.

SOCIAL IMPACT

Our work has a very positive social impact that affects different areas and groups.

INCLUSION

Through the distribution of food, we facilitate the social reintegration of the most disadvantaged in the Community of Madrid.

SUSTAINABILITY

We avoid the destruction of food and the emission of CO2, favoring sustainability.

We avoid rural depopulation through the withdrawal of fruit and vegetable program that provides jobs to farmers

EDUCATION

Teaching awareness workshops on, poverty, food waste and healthy eating.
